

2005 Indoor Club Championships

Mississauga won the Juvenile and Junior Indoor Club Championships and scored well enough in the other age categories to take the overall Ontario Club Championships for 2005. Mississauga scored 212 points to Niagara Olympic's 187 and Phoenix's 163. It was the club's first overall Indoor Club Championship since the competition began in 2000. The club's previous best placing was 2nd in 2003. The champion for the previous three years, Windsor Legion, was well back in 10th place with 106 points.

Phoenix, with strong performances in the sprints and middle distances, won the Senior Championship over Mississauga, 66 to 54 points.

Mississauga took the Junior Division title ahead of the relatively new club, York Flyers by a score of 69 to 45.

Mississauga also won the Juvenile division with 78 points against the 59 by both York Flyers and London-Western.

The Midget and Bantam team competitions were very tight. South Simcoe/Dufferin edged out Niagara Olympic 60 to 58.5 in the Midget class while a tie breaker was needed to declare Woodstock Legion as the Bantam champion. Both Woodstock and Durham Dragons had 56 points, the nod going to Woodstock on the basis of most events scored in.
